Admission Information for Academic 2018/2019

PRE-REQUISITE FOR BOTH LIBERIA AND INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSION

To enroll at Ricks Institute for academic 2018/2019, the following conditions must be met:

- Be at least thirteen (13) years old or in fourth (4th) grade and above. Admission is not allowed for grades **11 and 12** under **no condition**.
- Take a placement test to determine appropriate grade level.
- Complete and return an application form with a transcript and two (2) letters of recommendation (one from your English, Math or Science teacher from the last school attended, and one from a community leader/servant).
- Fulfill all registration fees and requirements.
- Fulfill Ricks medical requirements

GRADE AND AGE REQUIREMENTS ARE HIGHLY PRIORITZE

Ricks Institute runs from K-12. To be admitted in the boarding school program, a student must be 13 and/or in the 4th grade. New students are not accepted in the 11 and 12 grades.

TESTING

New students from grades 1-10 sit a placement test to be assigned in proper classes. The test is administered in Math and English. Students in **K4** and **K5** are assessed orally.

ADMISSION

Application Process: Ricks Institute welcomes applications from students of any tribe/ethnic origin, race, creed or color. The admission process begins in July for enrollment in the following academic year.

Any school fees that are not paid during the due date schedule will be charged \$50.00. All return checks are subject to a \$50 charge. Students will not be allowed in school until the late fees and school fees balances are paid.

MULTI-CHILD DISCOUNT PLAN

The multi-child discount begins with the third child of a family enrolled at Ricks Institute for the full academic year.

Boarding Students

The third child discount is \$300; the fourth child discount **\$450** annually.

Day Students

The multi-child discount for the third child is \$200, the fourth child is \$300 annually. The multi-child discount is not offered to families who already benefit from other tuition assistance programs offered at Ricks Institute. Employees are not eligible for the multi-child discount. Eligible families will receive the multi-child discount on their first tuition installment. Ricks Institute makes the final decisions on family unit eligibility for the multi-purpose discount.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Ricks institute has many expenses of a continuing nature such as faculty salaries, technology fees, and campus maintenance. In order to plan and maintain these services over the entire year, it is essential that the annual income and tuitions be assured. Parents, guardians, and/ or sponsors are responsible to pay all fees in spite of subsequent dismissal, expulsion, withdrawal, absence or any other reason of a student.

In the event a student has to withdraw from Ricks Institute, the parent/guardian must notify Ricks Administration in writing.

MISCELLANEOUS

Students who are absent from school because of unpaid fees will not be allowed makeup for instructional time missed.

CELL-PHONE AND USAGE

At Ricks Institute, students are not allowed to bring or use cellphones on campus. It is absolutely against our school rules. No student is allowed to carry along electronic devices that are using Telecommunication **SIM-CARDS** such as: Tablets with (SIM slogs) and all mobile phones. Our students are only allow to use laptop-computers and tablets that are **SIM** free. A student can be given punishment, suspension or expulsion base on administrative ruling.

EMERGENCY SITUATIONS: In the event of any sickness, or accident or other emergency situation involving the student at a time/place that is impractical for Ricks to contact the parent /guardian or for the parent/guardian to be present, the undersigned authorizes Ricks to temporarily act in *loco parentis* (in place of the parent) to approve or provide whatever immediate care, assistance, management or services the student may require. The undersigned agree to pay for any and or all expenses incurred in providing for such needs of the student. In case of an emergency and in the event that the parent cannot be contacted, the parent hereby grants permission for the student's records to be released and for necessary medical treatment to be administered.

WAIVER OF LIABILITY: It is expressly agreed that the participation by our child in any activity of RICKS, including, but not limited to class, recess, physical education, dining, sport, school-sponsored trips away from campus and any other school-related activity or extracurricular activity ,and the use of any school facility or property, shall be undertaken at my /our child's own risk .RICKS, its servants, agents and employees, shall not to be liable for any claims, demands, injuries, damages, actions or causes of actions whatsoever to us or our child property or our child's property arising out of ,or connected with our child being at RICKS. I/we do hereby expressly, forever release and discharge RICKS, Its agents employees and management from all such claims, demands, injuries, damages, actions or causes of action and from all acts of active or passive or negligence on the past of Ricks, its agents missing on the entire campus. While the institution will seek all measure to attend to missing (s) items, Ricks is not **LIABLE** for any missing items from a student.

The parents shall Ricks for any damage to Ricks' property caused by the student beyond reasonable wear and tear as determined by Ricks in its discretion.

The school shall not be liable for any student who leaves campus unauthorized or during an official/mandatory school break such as general weekends, Easter break, semesters' break etc.

GENERAL CONDITIONS: I agree to accept, support, and consent to the policies of Ricks, agree to cooperate with the faculty and administration of Ricks, in caring for my child or children in the instructional program and management of the school, and to cooperate in having my/ our child observes the rules and regulations of the school as promulgated by the principal/chief administrative officer in writing and orally and to observe the school standards for dress, behavior, and grooming. My/Our child's continued enrollment in Ricks will be contingent upon

the student's and parent's/ guardian's compliance with school's regulation. I acknowledge that Ricks has a disciplinary policy, which may subject all students, in k-12 grades, to corporal punishment and consent to its provisions. I also acknowledge that Ricks has a random drug and pregnancy testing policy, which may subject my/our child or children to drug and or pregnancy testing and consent to its provisions.

Students are re-enrolled on an annual basis subject to an evaluation of their academic achievement, conduct, and influence on others. The final decision rests with the principal. A student's re-enrollment may be held for disciplinary, academic, or financial reasons. The principal will notify parents if re-enrollment is to be withheld.

Ricks Institute admits students of any tribe, race, color, religious affiliation, and ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in the administration of its educational policies, scholarship and athletic and other school-administered programs. Any student guilty of bullying ant student due to physical challenge, race, physical appearance, ethnicity etc. will be expelled automatically.

Specifically, I agree that the school policy is zero tolerance with my child possessing cell phone, drugs, alcohol and tobacco. I further agree to the school policy that my child shall not engage in violence. Physical aggression, sexual or physical harassment, lying, stealing, plagiarism, and cheating. PROHIBITED MATERIALS AND ACTIVITIES

Illegal Drugs and Alcohol: Students should not possess, use or make arrangement for the use of alcohol, drugs, or related paraphernalia in the dorm, at school at any school or non-school function, or at any time. These substances are illegal and interfere with the healthy environment that the dormitory provides for the students. Students who violate this policy will be expelled immediately from the school, and if necessary, the State authority will be notified.

Tobacco Products: Tobacco products are not allowed anywhere on or off campus. If this policy is violated the student will be expelled immediately.

Other specific violation of policy includes but is not limited to:

- Possession or use of weapons of any kind.
 - Symbols of hatred and tribal/ethnic prejudice
 - Viewing pornographic website (internet)
 - Physical or verbal threats or posturing
 - Violence, physical aggression, sexual or physical harassment or disruptive behavior
 - Dishonesty, lying, cheating or stealing
 - Indecent or abusive language (including movies and music)
 - Tampering with light bulbs or safety equipment
 - Leaving campus without permission
 - Possession of cell phones
 - Possession or use of electrical appliances, except for computers and radios
- Violation of any of the aforementioned may lead to corporal punishment, suspension or expulsion.

DORMITORY SUPERVISOR

The Residence Supervisor is responsible for the overall management of all aspects a student's residence, having an overview of the day-to-day functions and keeping the program as a whole on tract. Discourteous behavior to the dorm supervisor may result in expulsion from the dorm/Ricks institute.

VISITATION

Parents and guardians are encouraged to visit occasionally. Visitation is monitored and controlled by the administration. Hence, a slip is provided by the Student Affairs Coordinator's office to be completed by the visitor(s) and returned for filling. Visitation is limited to parents, guardians and immediate family members (permitted by parents/guardians). Visitation is on Saturdays (1:30-3:30 pm) and Sundays (3:00pm-4:00pm).

THE HEALTH CARE CENTER/CLINIC

The Health Care Center seeks to provide the best possible medical care for students while at Ricks. Every student's health problem is addressed by the school's health care center. However, in the case of extreme emergency, appropriate referral will be made and parents/guardians will be informed immediately by the school's nurse or by the school's authority. Ricks Institute is not responsible for fees/charges provided outside the school.

ON AND OFF CAMPUS PASSES

Movements around camps are closely monitored by the school authority. A visit to any faculty home is strictly prohibited. Resident students leaving campus to attend a program perform an errand for the school or see their parents are issued an appropriate off-campus pass. Off-campus passes may be inspected by any of Ricks' staff at any time. Students coming to visit the library to do research or assignments before study hall time should come in their daily uniform. A resident student coming to the library for any of the reasons mentioned above is issued a pass bearing his/her name and departure time from the dorm. The pass is delivered to the librarian who accounts for the student listed on the pass and notes the departure time from the dorm for time elapse. The librarian records on the pass the arrival time and also signs in the departure time of the students when returning to the dorm. The pass is finally returned to the dorm supervisor, who takes note of event. GENERAL WEEKEND

General weekend is a break away given once every six-week period. It is generally aimed at easing the psychological pain of homesickness. Students also use this period to replenish needed incidentals. General weekend ends on Sunday. All students are expected in the dorm between 4:30-5:30 pm. Any student who arrives after 5:30pm is in violation of the rules and will be held accountable. General weekend is not a compulsory weekend. Students staying in the dorm during this break abide by all the rules and regulations of the dorm. They are responsible for their own cooking.

DORMITORY REGULATIONS

Consideration and Privacy: Students are expected to conduct themselves in the dorm at all times with consideration and respect for other residents. In particular, the privacy of each student and of his or her possession must be honored.

CLEANLINESS; Students are expected to keep their rooms neat and tidy, with beds made and clothes put away, at all times. Rooms are inspected frequently to ensure cleanliness. Mandatory and random room inspections will be performed by the Dorm Supervisor to ensure safety and health standards. Students will be charged a fine for any room damage, room cleaning services or vandalism.

Regulations governing study hours, check-in times, electrical appliances and decorations are displayed on house bulletin boards. These must be read and followed by all students. The use of alcohol references and pornographic materials to decorate rooms is forbidden. There should also be no loud music, no running in the residence, and no throwing of objects, no hanging out in open windows, or other impolite or unsafe behavior. **SIGN-IN/ SIGN OUT** is required when leaving or returning to the dorms. Name, destination, and time must be printed clearly, on one line, and completely in English each time a student leaves or enters the dorm. On weekends (Fridays & Saturdays), students must also sign-out/in.

Damage: Damages, beyond reasonable wear and tear, in student's rooms or in the public areas of the dorm, when not attributable to individuals, will be assessed equally among the residents and charged to them. The damage must be repaired without delay. Student's rooms are inspected upon arrival and departure. Damaged or missing items not previously reported and satisfactorily explained will be charged against offending students.

RICKS INSTITUTE HANDBOOK

Every residential student is expected to have a copy of the school's handbook and to follow the guidelines of the school in it.

STUDY HOURS are 7:00 pm- 9:00 pm on Sunday through Thursday nights. Study hours will take place in a designated area at the school.

QUIET HOURS are 8:30 pm to 7:00 am Sunday through Thursday, and start at 10:30 pm on Friday and Saturday.

OTHERS/ASSIGNED ROOMS- Residents must not enter another resident’s room without permission from that resident. No opposite sex visitors are allowed in any bedroom at any time.

Public Display of Affection (P.D.A) is not allowed on campus, at the dorms or at school events.

Vehicle:

Resident students are not allowed to board and or ride in any vehicle around campus. Parents/guardians are allowed to drive to the dormitories but not to ride students around.

VISITORS

Must be signed in and out with the dorm authority during visiting hours.

WEEKEND OR OVERNIGHT STAYS AWAY FROM THE DORM

This must be approved by the Dorm Supervisor and the Dean of Students in consultation with the principal three days prior to date of the absence. Students should be on time no matter where they are going (school, dinner, brunch, church, or study class). Tardiness is not acceptable.

MEALS

Meals are provided for the residents of the dorm as part of their package. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served Monday – Sunday in the Dining Hall main door closes 20 minutes after the bell is rung and any student coming thereafter is considered late and will forfeit the meal. Also, the student will be in violation of dorm regulations.
